# **REVIEW OF FINANCIAL STATE AND EXPLANATION OF MAJOR FINANCIAL TRANSACTIONS**

The Charity recorded a surplus of \$3,217,000 with \$\$2,467,000 in charitable related activities & \$\$750,000 from non charitable.

We had spent \$107,000 on construction of a temporary carpark to resolve the issue on lacking of parking space provided to the car owners of our volunteers and general public.

Fund raising appeals during the year had generated a total amount of S\$2,261,252, of which S\$548,055 was for General fund, S\$502,405 was raised for Local Relief purposes and S\$1,210,792 was meant for International Relief fund (in aids of the Typhoon Marakot survivors).

#### FUTURE PLANS AND COMMITMENTS

- CHARITY: The "Seeds of Hope" Bursary Program launched in June 2009 to provide bursaries to the needy secondary students in 2009 has been rewarded with overwhelming response. This bursary program will be continued in 2010 and looking forward to be extended to primary students in 2011.
- CHARITY: We will continue to work closely with the government or non-government parties involved in providing the relief to the poor and needy, be it financial or mental assistance. We will also provide regular training sessions for home visit volunteers in the community to enhance their case assessment ability in the home visit works.
- MEDICINE: The Reopening of free clinic at Redhill area has started providing free medical consultation and health screening to the residents and Tzu Chi beneficiaries since November 2008. Realizing the importance of "Prevention is better than Cure", we have worked with the Grass Root Organizations at Yuhua CCC, in setting up a Free Health Screening Centre at Blk 328, Jurong East Street 31, to provide daily free health screening services to all residents. The centre is expected to be opened in the mid of 2010.
- MEDICINE: We would continue to work closely with Red Cross to organize community blood donation drives to meet the requirement of blood usage of blood bank in Singapore. Free ad-hoc community health screening is another project to be worked together with grass-root organizations to benefit more local communities.
- OVERSEAS MEDICINE: We have worked with the local health agencies in Sri Lanka to
  organize overseas free medical missions in Sri Lanka twice a year in 2009. The free medical
  missions will be continued in 2010, to provide relief to more poor and needy in rural areas of
  Sri Lanka. The missions have also inspired many local medical personnel to give and deliver
  their love to the overseas needy.

- ENVIRONMENT PROTECTION: The Global Warming threat has become an important global issue. We have worked with various grass-root organizations in 2009 to organize Community Eco-Awareness talks to create awareness on the importance of environment protection and the response was overwhelming. We are determined to work with the GROs to set up more recycle points island-wide, to advocate the awareness on green environment, as well as to promote the spirit of volunteerism in the community, for better community cohesion.
- HUMANITY & EDUCATION: We would also continue to provide continuing education lessons such as Flower Arrangement, Tea Appreciation, Calligraphy, Guzheng, Phtography, Sign Language, Yoga and Qigong lessons to the local community. With the above-mentioned lessons, we hope to provide a platform of post-school learning for the public, and to enhance the public's health and humanistic accomplishment.
